### STYLE/DESIGN/PHYSICAL CHARACTERISTICS

This building is a former store in the hamlet of Lochalsh. It is a long, single store front gable frame structure clad in asphalt sheeting, facing the road. The low boomtown front has a large sign embossed with the name of the hamlet. An awning covers two windows and a double door. This building was likely built in the early 20th century before 1940.

### HISTORICAL ASSOCIATION

This store is on land occupied by D. McLennan in 1879. The McLennan family was originally from Lochalsh, Scotland and was one of the pioneering families in Concession 1, Huron Township, Bruce County.

### CONTEXT/COMMENTS

This building has good heritage character and is a local landmark.
